

2016 - THE YEAR OF REHABILITATION!

2016 has been an extraordinary year in the life of Ernestina-Morrissey. Her rehabilitation is well underway at Boothbay Harbor Shipyard. This work, directed by the Massachusetts DCR, would not have been possible without your support. We think the story is best told in pictures:


